Capital A is the symbol for the original Thomas (I)

Al is the symbol for his son Thomas II and

Ala is the symbol for Thomas II first child

Alb for his second child, Joseph

Albl for Joseph's first child, Mordecai

As the symbol grows longer Albl is replaced by a single symbol Z. From that point Z is the symbol for Mordecei, Joseph's son.

The name passes down from French Hugienot Millards, who were refugees from the persecutions in France in the Sixteenth Century, and fled to the British Islas. The name is found in England, Scotland and Ireland. Members of the family emigrated to America in the Seventeenth Century and settled in New England, Pennsylvania and South Carolina. The South Carolina branch is by tradition from Scotland. The New England branch has a tradition of arriving at Boston from England in 1650. Thomas Millard, the first of the Pennsylvania family, came either from England or from New England and may well have been a son or grandson of one of the brothers Thomas, John and Nehemiah, who landed at Boston in 1650.

In March 1683, Thomas Millard obtained a warrant from William Fenn for a lot in Philadelphia. In the same year, Clement Millard obtained warrants for three lots in Philadelphia and one in the "Liberties". Clement was probably of the minor English Gentry, for the warrants state that he was a purchaser (at a time previous to coming to America) of 5000 acres from William Fenn. The original documents, however, show that the warrants were cancelled for lack of payment and nothing further is known of Clement, although one hundred years later in Philadelphia, Thomas Millard, spinning-wheel maker, see Page 47, had a son, Clement Millard, M.D., one of seven children.

Thomas Millard was described in the warrant as a carpenter. He patented the lot and built upon it and sold it in 1691 to Charles Pickering (Phila.

of the Society of Friends, his associations were so largely with Friends that it is likely that he was a member. Family tradition is that early Millerds were Friends and Joseph and Benjamin are recorded to have been received into Exeter Meeting in 1784. Thomas was indebted to James Claypool in 1687 (Geneal. Socy. Pub. Vol. 1, 60); was in the Philadelphia County Tax List in 1693. In the same year was witness to a transfer of a tract in Shackamakunk Township, bordered on the WSW by Cohocksink Creek, on the ENE by Thomas Mairman land, on the ENW by Codson (now in North Philadelphia) (Penna. Archives EV-19-164). He may have built a mill on this property.

In 1695 he witnessed a deed to William Coleman of Philadelphia.

The original document (Pa. Hist. Soc.) shows a bold, characteristic signature.

In 1693 he was one of the signers of a petition for a road from the "Lime Kilns" to Plymouth road for hauling lime to Philadelphia and for the convenience of the townships of Robert Turner, Joseph Fisher, Samuel Carpenter, and other lands (Bills, Bonds, and Releases D2, No. 4, p 44, Land Office, Harrisburg). This road was in the area later included in Whitemarsh Township, Montgomery County.

In 1701 There was an agreement between "Thomas Millard, Jr., son of Thomas Millard, Sr., of Millaberry in Farmers Township, Philadelphia County, Millwright", of the first part, Thomas Millard, Sr., second Part, William Carter of Philadelphia, blockmaker, third part, and Edward Farmer of Whitemarsh, Sentleman, fourth part; whereby the Millards and Carter sold to Edward Farmer a half interest in 150 acres, buildings and mill, and in the profits of the mill. It is stated that this 150 acres was bought by Thomas Millard, Jr., from Edward Farmer in 1698, 22 acres were afterwards sold to Thomas Millard, Sr., and after that the whole mortgaged to Carter, all under the Manor of Springetts-berry, which was close to Philadelphia to the north (Phila. Deeds - Exemplif. Bk. 7-575).

Thomas Millard and Edward Farmer witnessed the will of Semuel Spencer in 1705 and of William Albertson of Bucks County in 1709 (Phila. Wills).

(In order to avoid confusion Thomas Sr. will here be designated as Thomas I and Thomas Jr. designated as Thomas II).

A Henry Millard, who is recorded as appointed with Isaac Bellarby administrators of the estate of Jeroma Deeble of Chester County in 1716, is supposed to be another son of Thomas I.

In 1711 Thomas II secured 1000 acres on the west bank of the Schiylkill above what is now Pottstown, through Thomas Fairman, Surveyor-General of Philadelphia County, a friend of his father. Twenty-four years later he found that Fairman, who had died in 1714, had no authority to dispose of this ground. Thomas Millard, II, therefore applied for and received from the Fenns, a grant for the lend, in which the facts of the earlier transaction were related. The Patent was dated 1739. The warrant was in the name of Thomas Miller, but later records show the name to be Millard. The surveys show that the lend was in two tracts, one of 620 acres located in Union Township, Berks County, opposite Douglasville, and one of 560 acres located in Coventry Township, Chester County, opposite the mouth of Manatawney Creek. The two tracts are not far apart.

In the meantime Thomas Millard is mentioned as follows: In 1713

Thomas Rumford desired to buy 300 acres on the Schuylkill "Above Thomas Millard's
Mill" (Pa. Arch. 2, Vol. 19-576); in 1714 Thomas Millard (probably Senior) acts
as advisor to brs. Fairman, the sole executor of Thomas Fairman's Estate. In

Fairman's will be devises to one daughter 300 acres in Whitemarsh of which "100
acres is of the Thomas Millard tract", and to enother daughter 300 acres in

Whitemarsh of which "50 acres is of the Thomas Millard tract," with house and orchard." (Phile. Wills, Bk. D, page 17).

In 1719 Quarter Sessions Court ordered a road opened "between Oley and Thomas Millerd's Mill", in the same year a grant was issued to Thomas Miller, millwright, of 200 acres on or near a branch of Manatawaey Creek, for which the survey is in the name of Thomas Millard (Old Rights, Harrisburg Ek. D78-270); in 1736 this land (a strip along both sides of the creek) he sold to Robert Stapleton, who patented it. It is likely that Thomas had built and operated a mill on it.

In 1739 Thomas gave a mortgage on the 620 acre tract for five years to secure a loan of £160, probably the amount due the Fenns in that year, in payment of both tracts. A grist mill and other buildings were on the 620 acre tract.

Verious dates from 1741 to 1761, to his sons Jonatham, Benjamin, Timothy,
and to son Joseph 200 acres in 1761, who deeded it to his son Mordecai in

1762. This ground probably included the old grist mill built by Thomas II.

Remains of the mill are pointed out on the river bank just north of Unionville.

These four sons were in the tax lists of 1754 in Union Township, Berks County.

Wolf Millard is supposed to be another son of Thomas II, as they were both taxed
in 1729 in Coventry Township, Chester County. Joseph and Benjamin were
admitted in 1748 to Exster Meeting of the Quakers. By an abstract of title
published in the Emaily Pottstown Ledger", February 22, 1890, Thomas Millard II,
sold 160 acres of the 360 acre tract (which is in Coventry Township, Chester
County) to his son Thomas III in 1761.

Philadelphia County; in 1752 Joseph was called a friend of and named a trustee of the estate of John Arbuckle of Coventry; in 1753 a certificate of election (Orig. Doc. State Lib.) certifies the election of "Joseph Millard, gentleman, and William Boone, keoman" to the office of Sheriff of Berks County. (The Court chose Boone); in 1754 Joseph withessed the will of Henry Gibson of Amity. and in 1757 he, Mordecai, and Thomas witnessed the will of Jonas Yocum of Douglas, across the river from Union Township; in 1750 a petition for a foad to Fort Augusta was signed by Joseph and Mordecai Millard, Mordecai Lincoln, William Boone, and others; in 1762 Joseph witnessed the will of William Clews, of Reading, Berks County; in 1764 "Joseph Millard, Esq.," witnessed the will of Charles McGrew, formerly of Virginia.

In a quit-claim deed made in 1769 by the heirs of Mordecai Lincoln, "Joseph Millard, Rsq.," is mentioned as the husband of Hennah Lincoln, then deceased.

Mordecai Millard, son of Joseph, Sr., and brother of Joseph, Jr., was taxed in Union Township, Berks County, from 1767 to 1785 on a grist mill, Saw mill and 180 acres of the 620 acre tract patented by his grandfather, Thomas II. He was a carpenter and millwright, miller, lumberman and farmer. He was forty years old at the time of the Revolution, but there is no mention of him in any military connection. Both he end his brother, Joseph, Jr., however, were darge producers of prime necessities and probably could not be spared for military service. His eldest son Joseph was only 13 years old in 1776.

Family tradition indicates that Mordecai assisted largely in the war, but no confirmatory records have yet been found. The family data below is from Mordecai's family Bible, now in possession of William Henry Millard of Cherokee, Iowa (in 1915).

Samuel Millard, youngest son of Mordecai was ten years old when his father died. At 17 he was apprenticed to a carpenter and cabinet maker and at 21, in 1805, finding himself foot loose and possessed of \$300. Mexican, he walked from his home on the Schuylkill to Pittaburgh, where he heard of the proposed Lewis and Clark Expedition from St. Louis for the exploration of the far north west. In the hope of joining this expedition he walked across what are now southern Ohio, southern Indiana, and southern Illinois, 12 days journey, without seeing a human habitation. Unfortunately, he arrived at Lt. Louis two weeks after the expedition had left. For some unknown reason he went by boat up the Mississippi. but returned in the fall to Missouri and spent the winter of 1805 and 1806 with Daniel Boone, probably a former neighbor in Berks County. In the spring he returned to PennsylvaniasCoot through morthern Ohio. The next we hear of him he purchased in 1807, 150 seres of land from his brother Joseph, in the hilly part of a 500 acre tract in Columbia County, Pa., upon which Joseph had settled after administering the devision of n ani 150 alian to u Nr. Pilkington. Mordecoi's estate.

Joseph's property is located in Brier Creek Township, Columbia
County near Willow Springs, across the Susquehanna River from Mifflinville.
On this property was located "Fort Jenkins". Samuel was then 23 years old.
He lived there 17 years improving the property and building a house and
bern. In the third year, 1810, he married Sally Bowman, daughter of Thomas
Bowman of Brier Creek, who was the grandfather of Bishop Bowman of the
Methodist Church. Sally was said to be the prettiest and most popular girl
of that section.

they determined they would move to Ohio and sold their property at Willow Springs at \$20. per acre. Sexuel seems to have had misgivings as to the Wisdom of moving to Ohio. At any rate, he made an excursion to Ohio on horseback. Becoming discouraged over the labor and difficulty involved in moving his family and settling in a frontier country, he decided to remain in Fennsylvania. Returning home through northern Ohio, he visited his wife's brother, Wesley Bowman, who had left Briar Creek and settled user Erie.

Wesley's father, Thomas Bowman, had died and his estate at Briar Creek was subject to division among his heirs. Sexuel bought Wesley's share of the estate for \$200. He then returned home and proceeded to buy the remaining shares from the other heirs and in or about 1823 he came into possession.

These properties are a short distance northeast from his former home, away from the river and not for from the present city of Berwick.

He developed a water power and set up a saw mill and a woolen mill. While the properties were being vacated by the former owners he lived with Shadrack Laycock in the stone house later called the Pilkington house. In 1834 he sold this house and 150 acres to a Mr. Filkington. He then had remaining 400 acres of land with several farm houses, a water power, saw mill and woolen mill.

In 1832 his wife Sallie died and in 1833 he married Frances Bacon.

In that year he sent his two oldest sons Thomas, age 24 and Elisha, age 20,

for a years schooling at Cazenovia Academy in Hadison County, New York.

A year later Thomas and Elisha took a trip as their father had done in 1805.

They walked to Pittsburgh, where, after working as carpenters for three months, they shapped on a steamboat to Cincinnati and there hired as part of a crew of 12 men to take two decked arks 80 feet long, lashed together to

New Orleans. Within 500 miles of their destination one of the boats was stove in and sunk, losing the cargo, except that which floated.

Thomas went ashore and cut wood for a time, but soon crossed the river and went to Natchez afoot. Thence he walked north and finally sense to a steamer on the river and hired on it to go to New Orleans. After four days there he took a boat up the river to Cincinnati; thence to Pitteburgh and walked home.

The account of this trip fails to mention Elisha after leaving Pittsburgh to go down the river, but it is probable he was with Thomas throughout the trip. On his return Thomas worked for his father for a time and taught school. He bought out Elisha and in 1839 he merried Marie L. Thomas. In the early forties both he and Elisha moved west to Three Rivers, Michigan, and afterward to Iowa. Elisha married Julia Ann Salzig about 1842.

In the great migratory movement of 1849 Samuel falt the call westward. His two oldest sons were in Michigan, the wife of his youth was dead and he himself was 65 years old and many of his neighbors were moving west. He sold his properties at Briar Oreak for \$4600. and in the spring of 1849 moved his family to a farm near Three Rivers, Michigan. At the time of his death in 1862, at the age of 78, he had just completed a fine new home in the town of Three Rivers.

Contemporary references to Samuel Millard indicate that he was very highly respected as a man of the highest character, industrious and painstaking in all his dealings. It is told that in carrying on his affairs he habitually burned one candle before breakfast and two candles after supper.

SAMUEL MILLARD "Chairmaker", son of Benjamin (Alc)

In 1743 a tract of 265 acres on a branch of Conewago Creek, now in Newberry Township, York County (Pat. Bk. 31-231) was patented to Edward Shiffer, who deeded it to Richard Peters (Lancaster Co. Bll8) who sold 220 acres of it to "Jonathan Hughes, late of Berks County", released in 1769 to Owen Hughes and Joseph Penrose in trust for the use of Jonathan's widow Elizabeth and his daughter, bagail - 220 acres. The ownership afterward came to bagail, who married Samuel Millard (York Co. 20, 136-136).

Now, 1764, Samuel Millard, yeoman and wife Abagail, of Newberry Twp., York County, deeds to Owen Hughes of Maiden Creek, Berks Co., 50 acres of the said tract and for a consideration of 175 pounds.

Thus it appears that Jonathan Hughes, father of abagail Millard, went from Maiden Greek, Berks County, to Newberry Twp., York County, at some time prior to his death in 1768 and bought 220 acres, which after his death became the property of abagail Millard and that in 1784 Sepuel and Abagail Millard moved from Berks County and occupied that Land, selling 50 acres of it to abagail's uncle. Owen Hughes for 175 pounds. In the same year there is a record of property in York County of the Estates of Even and Jonathan Hughes of Berks County, coming to abagail Millard and to her three sons Jonathan, Benjamin and Isaac Millard. (Berks D33) (Exster No. Mtg. Rec. 30).

Meanwhile, Samuel Millard is mentioned in his mothers, Jane's, will in 1786 and is in Berks County tax lists of 1781 and 1784 and in York County tax lists of 1784, 85, 86, 88, 89, 92, 93, 95, 97, 99, 1800, 01. In the census of 1790 he is listed in Newberry Twp., York County, with a family of six, including heads.

Semuel died in 1803, his estate was administered by Jonathan Millard, Mordecal Moore and others, of Fairview Township, The widow renounced her share in the estate and died in 1821. Her estate was administered by Jonathan Millard (L-153 GG).

Her estate included 143% and 72P in Fairview Township. Her children Jonathan, Benjamin and Isaac agreed to divide it between them. In the deeds of October 10 and November 25, 1822, between the three brothers (York H223, 5G 202-203 and H225) we learn that Benjamin and Isaac were Blacksmiths and that Isaac lived in Allen Township, Cumberland County; also, that Benjamin's wife was Elizabeth and Jonathan's wife was Phebe.

The will of Benjamin Millard of Fairview Township, dated 1840, proved 1841, mentions sons Jacob, Samuel, Michael and Andrew and daughters Sarah, Rebecca, Catherine and Mary (m. Peter Gressley). Sons, Jacob and Samuel, Executors (York S137-139). The farm of Benjamin passed to son Jacob (York S137).

of Jonathan nothing is known after the settlement of their mother's estate in 1822. In the census of 1810 Jonathan of Fairview Township, is credited with a family of nine, including heads. Jonathan in tax list of 1803 - 1 horse; Tax list 1808-09 - 1 yoke owen. In 1822 was called "yeoman".

There is a Richard Millard in the tex lists of 1801 and 1808, 1809, and a will of Jame Millard, widow, Moneghan Twp., in 1832, both without known connection with the others.
